

Copyright Registration Checklist for Musicians

Your quick-start guide to protecting your original music

What You're Protecting	eCO Application Steps (copyright.gov)
☐ Compositions (PA) – Melody, harmony, lyrics (the song itself)	1. Create eCO account
☐ Sound Recordings (SR) – A specific recorded version of the song	2. Choose type: PA or SR (or both if you wrote/performed)
Before You Register	3. Complete required fields:
☐ Final version of your song or recording	☐ Title, author(s), year of completion
☐ Creation date + contributor info	☐ Ownership and publication info
☐ Publication info (if released)	☐ Rights & permissions + certification
	4. Upload deposit copy
☐ Deposit copy (MP3, WAV, PDF, etc.)	5. Pay fee and submit
☐ Fee payment (usually \$65–\$85)	
Key Timing	Best Practices
☐ Unpublished: Register before releasing	☐ Register early—even for demos
☐ Published: Register within 3 months of release	☐ Use consistent file names/metadata
Collaboration Musts	☐ Keep dated records of your work
☐ Use a split sheet (names, roles, ownership %s, signatures)	☐ Register each version if used commercially
☐ Agree on authorship and ownership before registering	☐ Consult an attorney for complex or high-stakes situations
	× Avoid These Mistakes
Don't Confuse This!	Myong registration type (a.g. DA vs. CD)
□ Copyright ≠ Publishing	Wrong registration type (e.g., PA vs. SR)
• Copyright = legal ownership	Missing co-writer info
 Publishing = monetization and royalty collection 	Relying on "poor man's copyright" (mailing to yourself)
☐ Register with a PRO (ASCAP, BMI, SESAC) to collect royalties	Assuming distribution platforms handle registration
